Mission: The St. Michael and St. Rose Literacy Program is a 501C (3) Non-profit within the St. Michael and St. Rose parishes. Our mission is to provide our adult students with English language classes to support English language skills for reading, speaking, writing, and conversation so that they can adapt to living in our community. We've been serving immigrants and refugees since 2010. The program operates out of the St. Rose Parish Center which is located at 540 N. 31st Street.

History: Our literacy program started in 2010 at St. Michael's parish as an ESL program for Burmese refugees. Primarily, retired people from Catholic parishes worked one to one with a student one time per week to assist students to speak English. Current students come from Thailand, Mexico, Nicaragua, and The Democratic Republic of the Congo.

We are proud of our students success which includes: 57 U.S. citizens, 7 MATC students, better employment, and many homeowners.
